

BYO is a popular option for many restaurants and cafes but did you know it isn't regulated by the Office of Liquor and Gaming Regulation

It is managed by local councils and each local council has different rules. Things they consider are the safety, location and suitability of BYO in that area

GEOFF'S PARMESAN BISCUITS

Ingredients (makes approx. 4 doz. biscuits): - 500g of shredded Parmesan cheese (sharpness 4 or 5 is best); - Cracked pepper from a grinder; and - Wine (colour optional) -

Method - Pour wine into a wine glass, -

Pre-heat oven to 180deg., -

Place baking paper on flat oven tray, -

Sip wine, -

Place a food-layering mould or similar on the tray, -

Pour shredded cheese into the mould enough to cover the base, DO NOT build the cheese layer up, -

Repeat the above until tray is full, but leave space between each biscuit for spreading,

Sip wine, - Grind cracked pepper over each biscuit, -

Carefully place tray in oven for 10 mins until golden brown, -

Sip wine continually at this stage, -

Remove tray, DO NOT touch biscuits until they have hardened!, -

Long sip of wine, -

Carefully remove biscuits from tray (I use an egg-lifter) and let them cool completely before storing, -

Open new bottle of wine and pour into a wine glass, -

Repeat all steps until all cheese is used up, remembering to take in fluids as you bake!
