Val Chapman

Val was born in New Zealand where she grew up on a dairy farm.

For thirty-five years, she was a member of the NZ Plunket Society which looks after the welfare of mothers and babies. She was made a life member on her retirement.

Val was also very involved with the Women's Division of Federated Farmers, an organisation which helps improve the lifestyle of farmers on the land.

In 1995, Val moved to Brisbane where she spent the next twenty-five years. She was heavily involved in the View Club of which she is still a member.

She was a very keen sportswoman participating in a range of sports. She coached and umpired netball and, then, on her retirement took up golf.

In 1921, she moved to Noosa to be closer to family. She has two daughters and two granddaughters.

Tragically, she lost her only son, Leigh Chapman, to bone marrow cancer when he was fifty -seven. Leigh was a professional cyclist who represented New Zealand in the sport. He also cycled professionally in the US and in Europe. He took part in the World Champion-ships in Austria in 1987 and in France in 1989.

Barbara Grant

Barbara was born in Brisbane where she lived and worked until her retirement at the age of sixty-seven. She has two daughters. One was living in Nambour, the other in Noosa.

Barb already owned an investment property in Noosa so after retiring she moved to Noosa permanently so she could help one of her daughters who was studying on-line to be a kindergarten teacher whilst raising four young children.

Barb was a very hands-on granny for many years until her daughter finished her course.

Unfortunately, there were no jobs available in the Noosa area for inexperienced teachers, so Barb's daughter was forced to return to Brisbane where she secured and excellent position at Jean-Paul College.

Barb decided to stay on in Noosa. She has a wide range of interests. She likes to travel and a trip to Kangaroo Island is high on her bucket list.

Helga Lawrence

Helga was born in Germany. At the age of fourteen she came to Australia with her mother and stepfather. She didn't speak a word of English and the Australian Government believed she was too old to send to school.

Helga educated herself. Today, her English is better than most Australians.

Helga continued to educate herself until she became a qualified teacher of English as a second Language.


She married young, raised two children and then a granddaughter before retiring to Noosa fourteen years ago. She now has two great grandchildren.

The Lost World by Michael Crichton.






Eighteen months later, afraid that the Costa Rican government will find Isla Sorna and destroy the dinosaurs, Levine hastily embarks on an expedition to the island

without Malcolm. He arrives with a Costa Rican guide named Diego, but shortly after arriving, the two are attacked by mysterious creatures later identified as a pair of <u>Carnotaurus</u> who kill Diego. Eventually, Malcolm learns that Levine has gone missing there. Malcolm then goes to the island with a rescue team consisting of <u>Jack "Doc" Thorne</u>, an engineer and retired university professor; <u>Eddie Carr</u>, Thorne's assistant; and two stowaway children, <u>R. B. "Arby" Benton</u> and <u>Kelly Curtis</u>, who were working as Levine's research assistants. <u>Dr. Sarah Harding</u>, an <u>ethologist</u> and close friend of Malcolm, is also approached to join the expedition. Though she is initially unsure, she ultimately decides to meet them there.
