#### TSCHUTSCHA BRAUN

Tschutscha was born in Springvale, Victoria of Czechoslovakian parents who had escaped to Australia after their homeland was occupied by Nazi Germany. The details of their escape were never discussed but Tschutscha does know that her mother was forced to abandon a promising career as an Opera Singer.

They settled in Wodonga where they owned a bakery before returning to Europe.

From the ages of eleven to twentyseven, Tschutscha lived in Bavaria in the south east of Germany, close to the Austrian border. She was never happy there.

So, in 1988 she returned to Australia with her German husband. She studied nursing at South Bank Technical College and specialised in areas such as palliative care, home care and special care for people with severe spinal injuries.

Tschutscha retired in 2021 and currently lives "off the grid" on five beautiful acres in Imbil with only her cattle dog, Woof, for company.

She hopes to move a lot closer to Tewantin in the very near future. Her current hobbies are Yoga and

meditation but there is a good chance that Mah-Jong and Rummikub will be added to these shortly and also, she attended our last Book Club meeting.

#### JOY FENTY

Joy is a Kiwi by birth, a dietitian by profession and an Australian citizen since 2006. She has also been a teacher and a property developer. She and her late husband, Ken, travelled around Europe with a car and tent before settling in Hertfordshire in the south of England, for twelve months. They also spent time visiting Ken's relatives in Scotland and South Africa.

On returning to New Zealand, they resumed their property developing business seeking out appropriate sites and building, townhouses, units and factories. One project was a Motor Inn close to Auckland airport which they operated for two years. Between 1981 and 2015, Joy and Ken undertook many trips travelling around Australia in caravans towed by fourwheel drives and later a motor home.

There is very little of Australia they didn't visit. They both had elderly mothers living in Auckland so they spread their time between the Gold Coast Hinterland and Waikato in the northern part of New Zealand where they had a ten-acre block with horses and Aberdeen Angus Heifers. Australia became their permanent home in 2005. They settled in Montville where, together with Ken's son, they built The *Narrows Escape* which is now a muti award winning tourist resort.

Their last trip was a complete loop covering 25,000 kilometres. They arrived home just two weeks before Ken's 90th birthday. This ticked their final box on the list they created back in 1972.

One day whilst walking beside the Noosa River, Rhoda Denissen introduced herself to Joy who was quickly adopted by The Walkie-Talkie Probus girls.




