Dear Chris,

I am always happy to get the Probus newsletter, but I regret so much not being able to take part in any of the activities. Which brings me to the info I read saying that you will be celebrating the Club's 25<sup>th</sup> anniversary soon. Some of your members may wonder who is the hon.life member at the top of the members list. Who is Claudia Andersen? So I wondered if you wouldn't mind me making a contribution to the anniversary by writing about how the Tewantin-Noosa Probus club first started. Fortunately I have kept my old diaries.

Michael and I were both members of the Kenmore Millennium Probus club in Brisbane which Michael helped to set up because he was a member of Kenmore Rotary. As you Know, Probus clubs are started and sponsored by Rotary. When we moved from Brisbane and came to live in Cooroy in 2000, we very much hoped to join another Probus club. Unfortunately the only one in Cooroy was for men only. Noosa was not any better. There was a men only and a women only Club but not a Mixed. We were very disappointed. About a year later, however, moves were afoot to form a mixed club in Noosa. There was an ad in the local paper about the possibility, and to come to a meeting if interested. The snag for us, though, was that we were going to be away at the time of the meeting. Michael, however, phoned them and said to put our names down as being interested.

When we returned from our holiday later and were going through our pile of mail we found a letter from Noosa Rotary informing us that a club would be formed as they had the numbers. To our surprise, however, they told us that at their meeting Michael, in his absence, had been nominated as possible President of the new club! There were two nominations but the other candidate withdrew when he heard about Michael's previous involvement and experience in forming a Probus Club. I have an entry in my diary showing that the new Tewantin-Noosa Probus Club meeting took place at the Noosa RSL on the 20<sup>th</sup> May 2002 at 9.45 am when Michael was elected as President and a Committee formed. The first general meeting after this was on the 24<sup>th</sup> June at the Tewantin-Noosa Bowls Club which became our regular meeting place. And the membership grew and grew! Our first outing was to the Apollonian Hotel for a Spit Roast.

Michael and I spent many happy years as members and he would have been delighted to know that it is still going so well and flourishing. He passed away in November 2023. Some of you will still remember me, I hope. There isn't a Probus club here in Murwillumbah, unfortunately. There was one but it closed due to Covid and stayed closed. It couldn't have been as good as our club! I am glad that I am still a life member and receive the excellent newsletter which I look forward to.
