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Bargara Getaway, 2025

On Sunday November 16th at 9.30, in drizzling rain, we left Tewantin aboard the Mystic Mountains Touring Coach, driven by Owner/Operator Andrew Fallon.

Our first stop was the Gunabul Homestead in Gympie for morning tea. The rain continued.

We reached Childers in time for lunch at the Isis Club but didn't stop at the Backpackers Memorial as we had planned to do, because of persistent rain.

Rain followed us all the way to Bargara. We checked in to the Point Resort about 4.30. The units were not as luxurious as they appeared on the website. The more expensive units were acceptable, the cheaper units left a lot to be desired.

The rain persisted, so instead of dining at the Golf Club on our first night, most of us decided to stay in our units and order in pizza.

On Monday morning, the sun shone. We headed off to Mon Repos Turtle centre where we enjoyed the exhibits and the educational video.

Our next stop was the Hummock Lookout which is halfway between Bargara and Bundaberg. It is an extinct volcano which was named by Matthew Flinders. It rises ninety-six metres above sea level and has 360-degree views.

Lunch was at the Baltimore Café at the Port of Bundaberg. After lunch, Geoff and Linda joined us for a one-hour tour of Australia's largest Coral Farm. We learned all about growing coral and witnessed the wonder and beauty of more than two hundred species of marine life found along the Australian coastline. This was a first for all of us and one of the highlights of our week.

We returned to Bargara via Elliott Heads, a well-known haven for retirees. On Tuesday, we left the resort at 9.30 and headed straight for Fairymead House which was built in 1890 and played an important role in the early days of the sugar industry. Today it operates as both a Sugar History Museum and Functions venue.

Our next stop was the Bundaberg & District Historical Museum. Everyone seemed to enjoy revisiting the good ol' days.

Next was lunch at Café 1928. The minimum staff did well to look after us.

After lunch we visited the Hinkler Hall of Aviation which celebrates the life and achievements of Bert Hinkler, a lad born and bred in Bundaberg. Bert was a highly respected pioneer aviator. His two standout achievements were his pioneer solo flight from England to Australia in 1928 and the world's first solo flight across the South Atlantic in 1931.

Our next stop was a visit to Alexandra Park Zoo which is one of Queensland's oldest continuing running zoological fixtures.

That evening, the majority of us headed over to the Golf Club for an enjoyable meal and pleasant evening.

On Wednesday morning, we all enjoyed a 2 hour cruise on the Burnett River aboard the Bundy Belle. The commentary was interesting and well delivered and, on the way home, the skipper entertained us with several saxophone renditions.

Promptly at 12.30, the Bundy Belle docked at the wharf at Grunske's restaurant where Geoff and Linda were waiting to greet us. The seafood was as fresh and delicious as always and leftovers enjoyed by most of us that night.

At 9.45 on Thursday morning, we set out for Kalki Moon where most of us enjoyed morning tea whilst a few brave souls ordered tasting paddles.

Lunch was at Oodies, where we enjoyed comfort food and an intriguing display of memorabilia from yesteryear.

We arrived at Bundaberg Rum Distillery in time for the 2 o'clock tour.

Unfortunately, some of us had trouble hearing the commentary and it was very hot.

Our last evening was spent at Sandhills Sports Club. Geoff and Linda joined us and our driver Andrew also joined us, as our guest.

On Friday morning we left Bargara at 10'clock and had a quick stop at Amandine Lavender Fram. It was not Lavender season but most of us enjoyed browsing in the delightful shop full of aromatherapy products, jewellery and lots of other tempting products.

We then headed to Maryborough, making a short comfort stop at Childers on the way. Lunch was at Allowishus Delicious. Service was slow but the very limited staff did their best to serve us.
